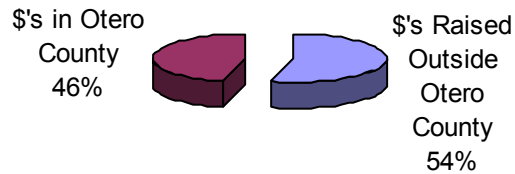

Secondary Prevention

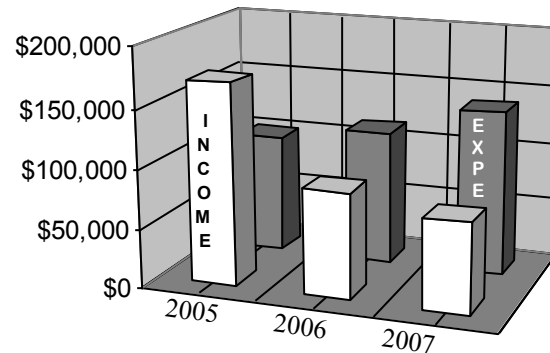
- CAPPED Angel Fund (55 Served with 26 cancers prevented or cured.)

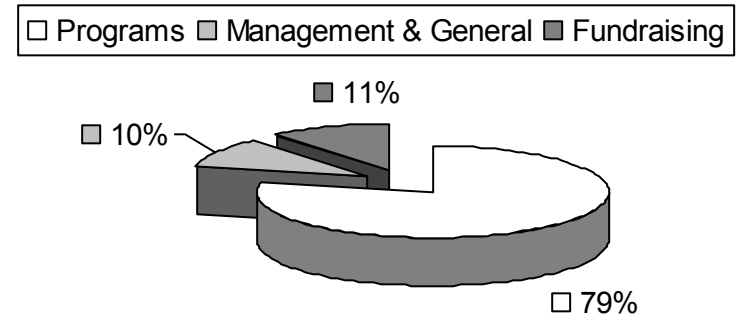
More than 9,178 people signed our register in the past 5 years!

Despite our best efforts to keep costs down, the functional expenses for The CAPPED Building, Angel Fund, Mammography and Sun Safe Programs have risen 52% from 2005-2007 as the programs and services have become well known. Our cash receipts, however, have fallen 55% during the same time-frame. We are working as hard as we can with only 2.3 full time employees, but we need financial help now if we are to keep our programs strong and reach our goals.
